Meet Coen, Jean and Kirra each with a different story to tell.


Meet Coen...

While it's good to help out family and friends, make sure you leave enough for yourself and your own financial commitments.

Tips to help protect your money from humbugging.

- 1. Don't share your card or PIN (secret number) because other people could use your money without you knowing.
- 2. Choose a PIN or keyword that you can remember but others can't guess.
- **3.** Do a budget that includes all of your own commitments first, like food, rent, electricity, phone bills, and then look at putting money aside for family and friends.
- 4. Check your bank statements via online banking regularly to make sure you know what is coming in and going out of your bank account. If something is not right, contact the bank.
- **5.** Set up a savings account, or secret account that can't easily be accessed from an ATM or while shopping.
