- Have a social or environmental mission.

We are particularly interested in developing relationships with:

- Businesses owned by Indigenous Australians;
- Businesses owned by women;
- Social Enterprises;
- Australian Disability Enterprises;
- B Corporations.

We prefer to use suppliers that have been independently certified or verified.

Businesses owned by Indigenous Australians:

- Are at least 50% owned by individuals of Australian Indigenous descent; and
- The business must be accredited by <u>Supply Nation</u> or listed with an Australian Indigenous Chamber of Commerce.

Businesses owned by Women:

- Are at least 51% owned, managed and controlled by one or more women; and
- May be certified by WeConnect International.

Social Enterprises:

- The enterprise has a defined primary social purpose, environmental or other public benefit;
- The enterprise derives a substantial portion of its income from trade;
- The enterprise reinvests 50% or more of annual profits towards achieving the social purpose;
- Should be certified by Social Traders or hold Australian charitable status.

Australian Disability Enterprises:

- Australian Disability Enterprises (ADEs) are generally not-for-profit organisations providing supported employment opportunities to people with disability;
- ADEs are funded by the Australian Government;
- Are listed on the <u>Buyability website.</u>

B Corporations:

- B Corporations meet specified standards of social and environmental performance, accountability and transparency as determined by a B Impact Assessment;
- Must be certified by the not-for-profit organisation <u>B Lab</u> and listed on the <u>Australian B Corporation directory</u>.
