

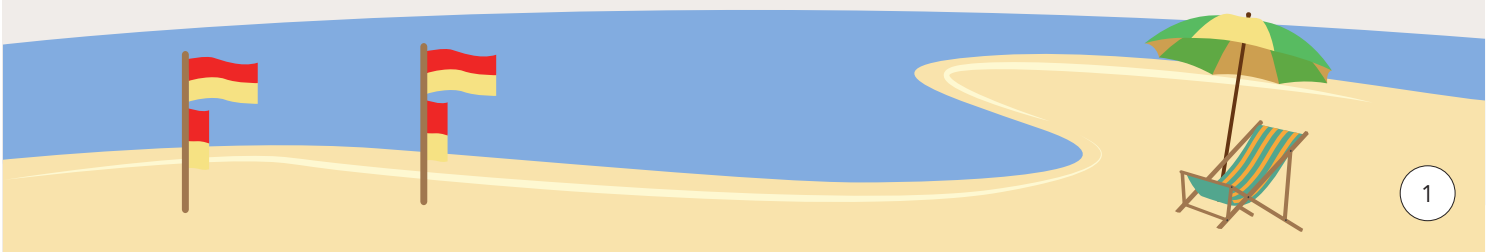

Safety = Prepared
